The distribution of New Zealand Pākehā Care and Protection FGC clients has decreased since 2006.


Overall, the age distribution of Care and Protection FGC clients has remained stable since 2006, with a slight increase in the under five years old group.

The number of Youth Justice FGC clients has also remained relatively stable, showing a slight increase in the ten to thirteen years old. Fresh Start legislative changes may have contributed to the rise in the ten to thirteen year old group with the ability to take older children, twelve and thirteen year olds, to Youth Court and ITC (s274(b)).

The following graphs show the age distribution of Care and Protection and Youth Justice Family Group Conferences held from 2006 to 2011.


