Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

Personal protective equipment (PPE) for non-health providers delivering services under the COVID-19 Protection Framework

This guidance provides advice for the appropriate PPE that should be worn by non-health providers **when unable to provide** services remotely and they need to deliver services under the COVID-19 Protection Framework. It is important before every interaction that providers risk assess the visit to determine how best to deliver services safely.

Note:

• Pre -arranged visits – ask the person to wear a medical mask, if they can tolerate it, during the visit.

¹ Particulate respirators must be fit tested, and staff know how to fit check their respirator.

² Eye protection includes goggles, face shield/visor. Prescription glasses are not classed as eye protection
