• Figures for the financial year 2015/16 for the number of constituents in the following constituencies that had Section 70 applied to their overseas government pensions and the combined total amount deducted from their entitlements to New Zealand Superannuation. If you cannot supply the exact figures, as close as possible will be accepted. Helensville. East coast. Upper Harbour: Nelson and Ohariu.

Please find enclosed the following table that shows the total number of Section 70 deductions for clients with a current New Zealand Superannuation and weekly amount deducted, by Work and Income regions requested, for financial year ending June 2016.
