On 28 February 2019, you emailed the Ministry requesting under the Official Information Act 1982, information regarding Kiribati people in New Zealand. On 6 March 2019, you refined your request to the number of Kiribati people in receipt of financial assistance.

The Ministry of Social Development provides income assistance and services to more than one million New Zealanders each year. Information about the different assistance, including eligibility is available at: <a href="https://www.workandincome.govt.nz/eligibility/index.html">www.workandincome.govt.nz/eligibility/index.html</a>.

To identify assistance provided to Kiribati people, the Ministry has reported on those people in receipt of a main benefit (this excludes Veteran's Pension, non-beneficiary assistance, Orphan's Benefit and Unsupported Child's Benefit) or in reciept of New Zealand Superannuation who have a country of birth or ethnicity of Kiribati recorded. Please note that ethnicity is self-identified by an individual.

The following table shows the number of people of Kiribati in receipt of a main benefit or New Zealand Superannuation, broken down by the type of assistance they received, as at the end of December 2018.
