On 9 June 2020, you emailed the Ministry requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982, the following information:

• information on volume and \$ on MSD grants and loans for dental treatment for the South Island (SI) and by each SI District Health Board (DHB) region

The Ministry provides recoverable and non-recoverable financial assistance to people to meet an immediate need for essential items such as food, health costs (including medical and dental costs), power and other costs. These payments are available to any person as long as they meet an income and asset test, and they are unable to meet the cost from any other source.

The Ministry recognises that individuals who are in receipt of a benefit may not be able to budget for unexpected dental costs, and support is available for those who meet the criteria to help with the cost of dental work.

The maximum amount payable to a person applying for a non-recoverable Special Needs Grant towards the cost of dental treatment is \$300 within any 52-week period. Where exceptional circumstances exist, this amount may be exceeded or more than one payment may be made. In situations where there are no exceptional circumstances, or where individuals do not meet the qualifying criteria for a Special Needs Grant, they may qualify for an Advance Payment of Benefit (APB) to meet any or all remaining costs. The amount of an APB depends on the client's immediate need. However, unless exceptional circumstances exist, these payments must not exceed six weeks of the client's full benefit rate.

All dental treatments funded through the Ministry must be provided by a health agency or registered dental practitioner. Examples of a qualifying dental situation include, but are not limited to, root treatment, tooth extraction, tooth restoration and treatment of acute infection.

Furthermore, SNG grants and Advance Payment of Benefit grants are recorded by MSD regions and Work and Income service centres, not DHB regions.

Please find enclosed five tables which show the number and amount of 'Advance Payment of Benefit' grants and 'Special Needs Grants' for emergency dental treatment for the time period 01 April 2019 to 31 March 2020, for the South Island of New Zealand, broken down by Service Centre and quarter, as outlined below:

Southern regions between 01 April 2019 to 31 March 2020 broken down by Service Centre and type of grant.

- Table Three: Number and amount of Special Needs Grants and Advance Payment of Benefit grants approved for emergency dental treatment in the regions Canterbury, Nelson, Southern regions by Service Centre and type of grant for the quarter ending September 2019.
- Table Four: Number and amount of Special Needs Grants and Advance Payment of Benefit grants approved for emergency dental treatment in the regions Canterbury, Nelson, Southern regions broken down by Service Centre and type of grant for the quarter ending December 2019.
- Table Five: Number and amount of Special Needs Grants and Advance Payment of Benefit grants approved for emergency dental treatment in the Canterbury, Nelson, Southern regions broken down by Service Centre and type of grant for the quarter ending March 2020.

Special Needs Grants and Advance Payment of Benefit grants for emergency dental treatment can also be granted by a Work and Income contact centre, as well as by other Ministry business units across the country (e.g., Studylink Processing Centre, Youth Service Support Unit, Central Processing Unit). However, when such grants are made at one of these centres, the region from which the client applied is not recorded. This means that the Ministry is unable to say how many of these clients reside in the South Island of New Zealand. For this reason, this information has been excluded in the data provided to you.

The principles and purposes of the Official Information Act 1982 under which you made your request are:

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- · to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.

This Ministry fully supports those principles and purposes. The Ministry therefore intends to make the information regarding the number and amount of SNG's and ADV's approved for emergency dental treatment and any attached documents available to the wider public shortly. The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter on the Ministry of Social Development's website. Your personal details will be deleted and the Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.
