On 29 March 2021, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

 Before 1 April 1992, there was a "Accommodation Benefit" which was paid to those that were renting privately. Could you please provide detailed information on this payment, ie payment rates, eligibility criteria, etc.

The Ministry has published a Social Assistance Chronology which started out as a historical list of policy changes to the social security system, however, over time it has expanded to include changes to social security benefits, war pensions, retirement pensions, taxation measures, family assistance, child welfare, housing, student support and labour market programmes.

As the information you have requested is publicly available on the Ministry's website, your request for this information is refused under section 18(d) of the Act.

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and

The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter on the Ministry of Social Development's website. Your personal details will be deleted and the

Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.
