On 30 November 2020, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982, the following information:

• The number of Special Needs Grant applications for food that have been declined in 2020.

The Ministry provides hardship assistance to help people pay for essential items or services they need urgently. Hardship assistance includes Special Needs Grants (SNGs) which provide non-taxable, one-off recoverable or non-recoverable financial assistance to people to meet immediate needs, such as food.

A person does not have to be getting a benefit to qualify for an SNG, but they must meet an income and asset test. More information about SNGs for food is available on Work and Income's website at: www.workandincome.govt.nz/eligibility/urgent-costs/food.html.

A request for hardship assistance for food can be declined if a client does not meet the eligibility qualifications and will depend on the client's individual circumstances. As such, decisions to approve Special Needs Grants can be discretionary (and are considered on a case by case basis).

To qualify for a Special Needs Grant for food, the applicant must:

- meet an income and cash asset test
- have an emergency or essential need
- not be able to meet the need from their own resources or through other sources
- have met any hardship obligations that have been applied to them
- be a New Zealand citizen or Permanent resident, and
- generally, be ordinarily resident in New Zealand.

Please find **Table One** attached which shows the number of Special Needs Grant applications processed and how many of these were declined and granted per month, from January 2020 to December 2020.

The principles and purposes of the Official Information Act 1982 under which you made your request are:

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.

This Ministry fully supports those principles and purposes. The Ministry therefore intends to make the information contained in this letter available to the wider public. The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter on the Ministry of Social Development's website. Your personal
