On 2 October 2021, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

- 1. The amount of flexi wage government funding allocated to this program
- 2. The total number of successful applicants.
- 3. The return on. Investment of these investments.
- 4. The current funding still available and unutilised.
- 5. The unemployment rate in New Zealand, and
- 6. The number of individuals and families currently receiving winz subsidy. These people are my target market as a demographic of low socioeconomic people, who will be most in need of genuine assistance, holistic health and optimal nutrition.

Flexi-wage provides a wage subsidy and extra assistance to support employers to take on people who do not meet the entry level requirements of the job. This helps people get the employment skills and experience they need to get into and stay in unsubsidised employment.

Flexi-wage Self-Employment supports people wanting to establish their own business. There are criteria that must be met to be eligible for support. More information about Flexi-wage Self-Employment can be found here:

For the sake of clarity, the Ministry will address your questions in turn:

1. The amount of flexi wage government funding allocated to this program

To support the Flexi-wage expansion that started on 15 February 2021, the Government invested an additional \$300 million into Flexi-wage. Of this, \$30 million has been ringfenced to support eligible people to start a new business through Flexi-wage Self-Employment.

2. The total number of successful applicants.

The Flexi-wage expansion started on 15 February 2021. As at 30 September 2021, 7,920 placements have been supported by the Flexi-wage. 318 of these placements have been into self-employment. For the same period in 2019, prior to COVID-19, there were 4,113 placements of which 84 were into self-employment.

3. The return on. Investment of these investments.

The Ministry has not completed a Cost Benefit Analysis, so cannot provide a return on investment value for Flexi-wage programmes. As such, this part of your request has been refused under section 18(e) of the Act, as the information requested does not exist.

4. The current funding still available and unutilised.

Approximately \$70 million has been committed as at 30 September 2021. Of this, approximately \$7 million is for Flexi-wage Self-Employment.

5. The unemployment rate in New Zealand

As such, this part of your request has been refused under section 18(d) of the Act, as the information request is publicly available.

6. The number of individuals and families currently receiving winz subsidy. These people are my target market as a demographic of low socioeconomic people, who will be most in need of genuine assistance, holistic health and optimal nutrition.
