

Tēnā koe

On 27 September 2021, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

- How many paid staff of programs funded by MSD are active members of gangs?
- What programs are they from?

The Ministry contracts non-governmental organisations and community groups across the country to deliver a range of programmes and services to New Zealanders. The Ministry does not collect or hold information on the individuals that are employed by these organisations – such as, whether they are members of or affiliated with gangs.

Providers funded by the Ministry must demonstrate that they have appropriate staff vetting processes in place; however, they are not required to share the personal information they receive through vetting of staff with the Ministry.

As such, I am refusing your request under section 18(g) of the Act as the information you have requested is not held by the Ministry and I have no grounds to believe that the information is held by another department or Minister of the Crown or organisation.

The principles and purposes of the Official Information Act 1982 under which you made your request are:

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.

This Ministry fully supports those principles and purposes. The Ministry therefore intends to make the information contained in this letter and any attached documents available to the wider public. The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter on the Ministry of Social Development's website. Your personal details will be deleted, and the Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.
