On 22 March 2022, you contacted the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

• How many people in total are receiving IRRS in Wairarapa? Preferably broken down by TLA.

Income Related Rent Subsidy is part of the Government's financial support for social housing.

Social housing providers are paid for the difference between the value of the Income Related Rent and the market rent rate or agreed rent rate for their social housing properties. This payment is called the Income Related Rent Subsidy.

Social housing providers are responsible for calculating the amount of the Income Related Rent Subsidy and claiming the amount from the Ministry of Social Development.

The Ministry of Social Development is responsible for processing the Income Related Rent Subsidy claims and paying the housing provider.

Please see enclosed **Table One**, which outlines the number of clients with Income Related Rent Subsidy in the Masterton, Carterton and South Wairarapa Territorial Local Authority (TLA), as at end of January 2022.

You will notice that a large proportion of people receiving an Income Related Rent Subsidy are in the Masterton District TLA. This is because the Masterton TLA is a more populated area and there are a higher number of Social Housing properties in this area compared to the Carterton and South Wairarapa District TLAs.

Table One: The number of clients with Income Related Rent Subsidy in the Masterton, Carterton and South Wairarapa Territorial Local Authority (TLA), as at end of January 2022.

## **Notes for Table One:**

- To protect confidentiality the Ministry uses processes to make it difficult to identify an individual person or entity from published data.
- These data tables have had random rounding to base three applied to all cell counts in the table.
- The impact of applying random rounding is that columns and rows may not add exactly to the given column or row totals.
- The published counts will never differ by more than two counts.

- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
