On 4 July 2022, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

• The number of people in Emergency Accommodation in Rotorua who, in their initial application for an Emergency Housing Special Needs Grant, voluntarily disclosed gang affiliations

In their initial application for an Emergency Housing Special Needs Grant, a client is asked to disclose any gang affiliations they might have. Such information, if provided, is used to help ensure client safety and enables the Ministry to engage the appropriate support service/s for the whānau.

I am unable to provide you with the information you have requested as it is held in notes on individual case files. In order to provide you with this information, Ministry staff would have to manually review a substantial number of files. As such, I refuse your request under section 18(f) of the Act. The greater public interest is in the effective and efficient administration of the public service.

I have considered whether the Ministry would be able to respond to your request given extra time, or the ability to charge for the information requested. I have concluded that, in either case, the Ministry's ability to undertake its work would still be prejudiced.

The principles and purposes of the Official Information Act 1982 under which you made your request are:

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.

This Ministry fully supports those principles and purposes. The Ministry therefore intends to make the information contained in this letter and any attached documents available to the wider public. The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter on the Ministry's website. Your personal details will be deleted, and the Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.

If you are not satisfied with this response regarding gang affiliation of those who have applied for Emergency Housing Special Needs Grants, you have the right to seek an investigation and review by the Ombudsman.
