On 31 March 2022, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

- Meeting with Hon Poto Williams on Resilience to Organised Crime in Communities - REP/22/2/098 - 18/02/2022
- Next steps for engagement on the Working for Families Review REP/22/2/067 18/02/2022

Please find the two documents enclosed in this response.

The Ministry is working closely with New Zealand Police, the lead policy agency for Resilience to Organised Crime in Communities (ROCC).

Some information is withheld under section 9(2)(f)(iv) of the Act to maintain the constitutional conventions for the time being which protect the confidentiality of advice tendered by Ministers of the Crown and officials. The release of this information is likely to prejudice the ability of government to consider advice and the wider public interest of effective government would not be served.

The principles and purposes of the Official Information Act 1982 under which you made your request are:

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.

This Ministry fully supports those principles and purposes. The Ministry therefore intends to make the information contained in this letter and any attached documents available to the wider public. The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter and attachments on the Ministry's website. Your

personal details will be deleted, and the Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.
