Tēnā koe

On 25 July 2023, you emailed Kāinga Ora, requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

• I would like to request non-specific information about the percentage of tenants with chronic illness, mental illness, physical disability, and intellectual/learning disability. If it is available I would like the percentages for each group.

On 2 August 2023, Kāinga Ora transferred your request to the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) to respond to.

On 4 August 2023, the Ministry contacted you to request refinement of your request. You were advised that the data the Ministry can provide you with is only for tenants in public housing who also have an incapacity linked to their current benefit. We also suggested providing you with the most recent data available for the end of June quarter 2023.

You responded on 5 August 2023 and confirmed refinement of your request.

Since your refined request seeks information on people who are on a benefit with a medical incapacity, the relevant benefit payments are the Jobseeker Support – Health Condition, Injury, or Disability (JS HCD) and Supported Living Payment (SLP).

Beneficiaries receiving these benefits must have a signed medical certificate from an independent health practitioner, which states the primary reason they are unable to work.

- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and

The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter and attachments on the Ministry's website. Your personal details will be deleted, and the Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.

- Reporting of incapacity is based on the primary incapacity of the main tenant.
- Benefits included in this data are Supported Living Payment and Jobseeker Support Health Condition, Injury and Disability (JS-HCD).
- To protect confidentiality, the Ministry of Social Development uses processes to make it difficult to identify an individual person or entity from published data.
- These data tables have had random rounding to base three applied to all cell counts in the table.
- Random rounding does not round down to zero, a value of one or two will be rounded to three.
- The impact of applying random rounding is that columns and rows may not add exactly to the given column
 or row totals.
- The published counts will never differ by more than two counts.
