The Ministry of Youth Development's (MYD) – Te Manatū Whakahiato Taiohi funding supports programmes and services that promote the use of a positive youth development approach to help improve the wellbeing of young people across Aotearoa New Zealand, so that they are better able to succeed in, contribute to, and enjoy life.

MYD aims to distribute funding equitably to ensure there is access to youth development opportunities for young people who are disproportionately disadvantaged. MYD has seven priority cohorts: rangatahi Māori, young Pacific people, young women, young people with disabilities, young people from rainbow communities, young people from ethnic communities (in particular those from a refugee and migrant background), and young people in the regions.
