Tēnā koe

On 4 September 2023, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

- how many families nationwide have children of student age in a household who:
 - o Rely on financial support from Work and Income, and
 - Seek support with school stationery costs.

To answer your request, we are providing two tables in the attached **Appendix**.

Table One answers your first question and shows the number of people who are of working age (ie. 18 to 64 years old) who receive a main benefit, and who have at least one dependent child aged 5 to 18 years old.

Table Two shows the number of Hardship Grants for the reason 'school stationery' and answers your second question. This table shows all the grants given specifically for school stationery to those who have sought this support irrespective of what benefit, if any, the person was receiving. It also covers a person who received assistance for stationery but who may not be of working age and would therefore not be included in **Table One.**

You may be interested to know there is also a School and Year Start-Up payment for people who are receiving the Unsupported Child's Benefit or Orphan's Benefit. This is a once-a-year payment and this payment is to help with the costs that mostly happen at the beginning of the year, in particular pre-school and school-related costs such as clothing, school fees and stationery. If you are interested in this information, you are welcome to make a new request for this information, however, please note the data Ministry can report on in regard to this payment type does not break down what this payment is specifically used for, ie. school stationery.

The principles and purposes of the Official Information Act 1982 under which you made your request are:

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.

This Ministry fully supports those principles and purposes. The Ministry therefore intends to make the information contained in this letter and any attached documents available to the wider public. The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter on the Ministry's website. Your personal details will be deleted, and the Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.
