On 31 August 2023, your request under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act) was transferred to the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) for response. You requested the following information about the International Custody Dispute Payment:

- 1. from 2010 to 2022 how many applications were submitted for this payment in New Zealand.
- 2. from 2010 2022 how many applications submitted were successful in obtaining payments
- 3. What country was the "applicant" applying from? Eg was it a parent here in New Zealand, or a parent that is in Australia but is a New Zealand citizen and stuck in Australia from The Hague Convention?

The International Custody Dispute Payment is a non-recoverable Special Needs Grant (SNG). It is paid to a parent who is awaiting the outcome of an international custody dispute, has no other means of support (such as work, support from their government or family, or other support from New Zealand) and is facing financial hardship.
