Official Information Act request

Thank you for your email of 28 July 2025 requesting the Ministry of Social Development's (the Ministry's) operational guidelines for determining whether temporary absences from New Zealand can be counted as time spent 'resident and present' in New Zealand for the purpose of qualifying for New Zealand Superannuation (NZS).
