Emergency housing is short-term accommodation (usually in motels) for individuals who have an urgent need because they are unable to remain in their usual place of residence. It is funded through Special Needs Grants that clients apply for when they cannot access accommodation and we have explored all the other options available to them. Grants can cover between one and 21 nights of accommodation at a time.


## Emergency housing – at the end of the month




The number of Emergency Housing Special Needs Grants (EH-SNGs) dropped by around 1,180 last month. This reduction was partially because some EH-SNGs in December were granted for longer durations to cover the holiday period.

The number of households in emergency housing has continued to trend down since January 2022, reaching 3,276 (down 66) households in January 2023. The decrease in client numbers was smaller this month, which may reflect the fewer working days over the holiday period, as there is less time for people to transition into alternative accommodation. There have been 1,410 (30.1 percent) fewer households in emergency housing between January 2022 and January 2023.

The East Coast and Wellington regions saw the largest decreases in the number of households in emergency housing last month. The overall decrease was offset by small increases in the Auckland and Canterbury regions.









The Public Housing Register is a non-time bound list of all applicants eligible to be placed in public housing. Applicants complete a public housing assessment which determines eligibility and priority for public housing against an agreed set of criteria, which is then used to assist the public housing provider in matching to the most appropriate property.








# **Public Housing Register numbers**













Percentage of main applicants, by ethnicity 12 - as at end of the month

#### Commentary

There were 28,668 applications in the Public Housing Register as at the end of January 2023, an increase of 501 (1.8 percent) compared to the end of December. This increase was partially due to fewer applicants housed or who went into public housing as there were fewer working days during January,. This had an impact on placements due to fewer processing days.

Most regions, except Northland, had an increase in applications in January.

System improvements continued to be undertaken to increase the capacity for register management. These improvements have resulted in the completion of one year's worth of housing register conversations in 12 weeks, along with an increase of public housing applications with closure pending status. This trend is likely to continue over the next few months as improvements are completed.
